1. INTRODUCTION

This quarterly assessment has been produced to enable the Mid Argyll, Kintyre and the Islands Community Safety Partnership to make informed decisions on the allocation of resources and funding, to ensure that partnership priorities are being met. The quarterly assessment is intended to compliment single agency operational plans by considering a partnership approach to emerging Community Safety issues.

- Single agency plans e.g. Strathclyde Police's Force/Divisional priorities and Community policing plans, Strathclyde Fire and Rescue Area Plans, NHS Highland Service Plans.

The Mid Argyll, Kintyre and the Islands Community Safety Forum will meet quarterly

and share information on emerging trends with a view to determining preventative, intelligence and enforcement priorities for the partnership. These will be reviewed at each meeting and partners will be asked to provide updates in respect of any actions that have been allocated.
