The formation of ABRA is a key action outlined within the CPP Renewable Energy Action Plan. Following agreement of the Terms of Reference, drafted in partnership with HIE, and presented to the CPP Management Committee for endorsement, all proposed members (as outlined in the ToR) were invited to the inaugural meeting of the alliance, held Friday 18th March 2011.

The Alliance aims to facilitate a strategic overview of renewable development, and a greater awareness of all the issues relating to this development, across Argyll and Bute, as well as assist with further implementation of the REAP.

The inaugural meeting brought together key partners, including Argyll and Bute Council, the Scottish Government, Marine Scotland, Highlands and Islands Enterprise, Scottish Power Renewables, Scottish and Southern Energy, Crown Estate Commission and Skills Development Scotland.

A positive response was expressed by all partners from the inaugural meeting, who strongly supported the objectives and terms of reference of the alliance. ABRA will now work closely to progress action points identified from this meeting, and consider key themes, such as infrastructure, identified for future discussion.

It was agreed that three meetings of ABRA per annum was sufficient. Subsequent meeting dates have been proposed for June and October 2011.
