<p>Activity Summary in Period (please state period you are reporting on)</p>	<p>Report focuses on success measures relating to anti social offences and violence (CPO9). Data gathered as part of the review for period 2010 -11 of the Community Safety strategy (2009-12)</p> <p>A priority for community safety partners has been to tackle anti social behaviour and alcohol related disorder and violence in towns and neighbourhoods. Partnership problem solving meetings have been a key feature of working to identify responses to problem hotspots and persistent offenders - sharing information and intelligence and implementing joint action.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mobile CCTV cameras deployed at ASB problem hotspots (6 deployments Campbeltown, Ardrishaig, Dunoon) with positive qualitative evaluation • Police enforcement of public drinking byelaws resulting in increased detections for consumption of alcohol in designated places -221 detections 2010-2011 (79 detections '09-'10, 56 detections'08-'09) • Reduction in number of common assaults – 759 recorded incidents 2010-2011 (793 incidents '09-'10, 819 incidents '08-'09) • Multi agency age restricted sales seminars to license holders as part of an education approach to tackling underage sales • Implementation of anti social behaviour and housing tenancy measures to resolve neighbourhood problems -ASB Cases resolved as a percentage of cases received 70% average FY10/11
<p>Key Challenges & Actions to Address</p>	<p>Priorities identified as a result of community engagement activity are:</p> <p>Drug dealing/Use (identified by public as number one priority in Bute, Cowal and Mid Argyll Kintyre and the Islands)</p> <p>Drunk and Disorderly Behaviour including vandalism and graffiti (key priority in all areas and particularly, for the public, in Oban and Helensburgh and Lomond)</p> <p>Assault/Violent crime (number two priority identified by the public in Helensburgh and Lomond and number three priority in all other areas)</p> <p>These priorities will remain a focus for area community safety partnerships and are incorporated in area action plans</p>
