AUDIT SCOTLAND REPORTS – COMMUNITY PLANNING AND HEALTH INEQUALITIES

1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The main purpose of this report is to provide an update on progress of the Community Planning Partnership in relation to two Audit Scotland National Reports on Improving Community Planning and Health Inequalities in Scotland.

In 2013 Audit Scotland issued national reports on Improving Community Planning and Health Inequalities in Scotland. The Audit Committee considered a report in both June and September 2013 in respect of progress in relation to these two Audit Scotland national reports. It was agreed that a progress report be brought to the June meeting.

Actions identified in the report to Audit Committee in September, relating to tackling inequalities and prevention through the Single Outcome Agreement (SOA), are complete through the development of Delivery Plans. These Delivery Plans have been endorsed by the Community Planning Partnership Management Committee and will go to Council on 26 June for endorsement and agreement that they be submitted to the Scottish Government.

There are no direct financial implications within this report. The Councils contribution to delivery of the SOA and financial consequences will need to be considered as part of future budgets.

It is recommended that members agree the update of progress within 4.2 satisfies the requirements in the national report and the quality assurance process.
