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INTRODUCTION

Due to the current situation this year in relation to COVID-19, and in keeping with government guidelines on physical distancing, all courses in this catalogue will be accessed via webinars, e-learning licences, and supported online discussion forums.

The programme will run from August 2020 until January 2021.

Delivering courses this way will also avoid travel, reduce the need for staff cover and make training more accessible for all.

These courses are funded by the Local Authority's Workforce Development budget and open to all Education staff, Childcare Workers and Childminders within Argyll and Bute.

Places are limited and will be offered on a first come, first served basis. If courses are oversubscribed it may be necessary to limit the number of places per setting.

For courses where an actual date is secured, a £30 administration fee will still apply to all those who fail to attend without notice. We require this cancellation 3 days in advance of the course in order to help us to enable us to fill the space. All cancellations have to be made by email.




THE LITTLE ICEBERG: WHY HELPING CHILDREN TO TRUST HELPS THEIR ACADEMIC LEARNING

Children will have had a range of experiences during COVID lockdown. We need to stay curious about what those were, so that we can help where they are carrying fears and uncertainties. When adults don't tune into the behaviours that signal such feelings, children withdraw emotionally. When children can't trust, they can't learn. This seminar will use the newly published book 'The Little Iceberg' as a way of exploring these dynamics. Attendance includes a copy of the storybook (one book per setting).

NURTURING ENVIRONMENTS

Can we have effective learning without every child having a sense of being nurtured?

'Children who've grown up without nurture may often lack any sense that they can be something other than what they are.'

In this session we will consider how our environments build: Trust, patience, responsibility, empathy and self reliance. We will explore perceptual development and emotional health, the need to listen actively, consider limitations and offer fairness and consistency.

PAEDIATRIC FIRST AID

Due to the restrictions arising from COVID-19, First Aid training will take a different format this year.

All theory training will take place in two 1.5 hour sessions over two consecutive days on the dates below via Google Meet. All practical aspects of this training will be delivered after January 2021, dates to be confirmed.

The aim of these webinars is to give people information on different first aid situations they may encounter whilst looking after young children, and how to deal with them. It also looks at how to recognise and respond to serious medical conditions and injuries. The course includes training on shock, bleeding, burns, scalds, choking, broken bones, head injuries, bites and eye injuries. It also covers awareness and recognition of meningitis and anaphylactic shock, the contents of a first aid kit and the recording of accidents and incidents.

Please note that this training complies with the Care Inspectorate requirement for a current Paediatric First Aid certificate; where 'current' means re-certification within the last three years by an approved First Aid provider, and 'paediatric' means the course includes child and infant CPR, choking, illnesses and is at least six hours long. This new format has been agreed by the Care Inspectorate for this course catalogue.

What is a social story? This is a short, practical session which aims to equip practitioners with the tools required to begin using social stories in their practice.





It involves considering our interactions and how we can encourage children to extend their mathematical thinking. There will also be some practical games and activities. The webinar aims to explore:

- Outdoor play as a key, everyday approach to building children's mathematical confidence.
- Practical ways to offer the context for exploring and developing maths concepts in children aged 3-6.
- Practical games, tools and techniques you can immediately start using.

MUD, MESS AND MAGIC: DEVELOPING YOUR OUTDOOR PROVISION ON A SHOESTRING

There is now plenty of research that suggests that children need and enjoy playing in natural spaces. A well-planned and designed natural play space can provide experiences that:


- Improve children's physical development.
- Enable children to think and play in creative and imaginative ways.
- Promote positive physical risk taking within a framework of safety.
- Help children learn more about the natural world and increases children's knowledge about nature.
- Provide a valuable context for developing life skills including literacy and numeracy.
- Create a calmer outdoor space which is more restorative and enables children to better focus.

This webinar explores how Nicolson's Theory of Loose Parts and Gibson's Affordance Theory can be utilised to create simple changes to your outdoor space, through a participatory approach that involves your children throughout the process. In doing so, the biodiversity of your outdoor space will be improved and it becomes a better place not just for learning and play but for wildlife too. The emphasis is on sustainable low-cost and doable ideas that don't involve digging up the asphalt.

After the webinar you will get access to additional resources that help you develop your practice and keep track of what you need to do to develop your outdoor provision. This webinar is aimed at educators who work with children aged 3-11yrs.

CHILD PROTECTION ONLINE WORKSHOP FOR MANAGERS AND DESIGNATED CHILD PROTECTION OFFICERS

Child protection online workshop for managers and designated child protection officers in early years and child care settings.

This 2 hour online workshop is for people who have a management or designated responsibility for child protection within their agency with input from social work. In particular those who:

- Have a lead role in referring child protection concerns to police or social work

- There will be additional time available at the end of the session for further discussion if required.







REALISING THE AMBITION BEING ME BOOK CLUB

OUT IN THE OPEN Outdoor Spaces - Documents and Dialogue

This course will run over a block of sessions and will facilitate practitioners with the tools and knowledge to effectively evaluate and improve their outdoor learning spaces.

Underpinned by documents and policy and through professional dialogue, you will self-reflect and identify an area of improvement within your outdoor context and begin the journey of improvement in a collaborative and supportive environment.

The course consists of online training and discussions followed by some work with your team and stakeholders. Each practitioner will follow a set structure within the course while meeting the individual requirements of their setting.

Course Aims:-

- Build confidence and capability of those who work with children and families to actively promote and deliver quality outdoor experiences in safe and stimulating environments
- Make links between practice, theory and policy guidance to reinforce aspects
 of high quality provision and the critical role practitioners play
- Provide advice on achieving the highest quality of ELC provision that will enable young children to experience and to play their own part in Scotland being the best place in the world to grow up
- Support improvement and quality by encouraging discussion, self-reflection and questioning about outdoor learning relevant practice in each context

Due to the nature of this course we will require all attendees to commit to every session as it follows a very tight timescale. Unfortunately late entry on this course would not be possible due to the structure of the delivery. 

Open to all Early Years practitioners in Scotland Funded by the Scottish Government and delivered by Living Classrooms with Dr. Claire Warden.


Scottish Virtual Nature School is an innovative response to challenges caused by the pandemic. The project has 2 unique elements:

- 1. To equip **early years practitioners** with skills to work outdoors with young children through nature-based, inquiry-led learning
- 2. To provide **children** with fun, engaging daily provocations and virtual interaction with their peers while at home.

There are 8 nature-based inquiries that have 40 provocation films, available now on Youtube, to support both children and adults. Practitioners have been using them as training for staff, as daily provocations for interested children 3-6 year olds in settings and as a family support for blended learning in the early years.
