## ARGYLL AND BUTE COUNCIL (B875 GREENWOOD JUNCTION-DRUMACHLOY BRIDGE ROAD, ISLE OF BUTE) (BUTEFEST EVENT) (TEMPORARY TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT) ORDER 2024



On Thursday the 27<sup>th</sup> July 2024, Argyll and Bute Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 62 of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984, made the above named Order.

No person may a) cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time or 2) drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour on that section of the B875 Greenwood Junction-Drumachloy Bridge Road which extends from its junction with the Glenmore Road (UC006) in a south westerly direction for a distance of one kilometre or thereby or 3) drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour on that section when indicated by signs of the B875 Greenwood Junction-Drumachloy Bridge Road for a distance of one hundred metres or thereby. The prohibition on use of road will only have effect in relation to such part or parts of the length of road as indicated by appropriate traffic signs.

The restrictions, which are desirable because of considerations of public safety and convenience whilst the Butefest Music Festival is taking place, will be in operation when indicated by signs between 0900 hours on Thursday the 26<sup>th</sup> of July and 1700 hours on Monday the 29<sup>th</sup> of July 2024.

Exemptions apply to vehicles whilst being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance, police or coastguard purposes.

Contravention of the Order, which may be inspected at the Argyll and Bute Council Offices, Kilmory, Lochgilphead, could result in a penalty of up to £500.
