(ARGYLL STREET AND CHURCH STREET DUNOON)
(SPECIAL EVENT)(TEMPORARY TRAFFIC
MANAGEMENT) (No.2) ORDER 2024



On Thursday 7th November 2024, Argyll and Bute Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 16(A) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, with the consent of the Scottish Ministers under Section 16(B)(6)(b) of the said Act, made the above named Order, the effect of which will be that for a temporary period, the following restrictions will apply:

Prohibition of Traffic Argyll Street, Dunoon	Extent of Restriction Extending from its junction with the A815 Alexandra Parade to its junction with John Street a distance of 475 metres or thereby.
Ferry Brae, Dunoon	Extending from its junction with the School Brae to its junction with Argyll Street a distance of 35 metres or thereby.
No Waiting/No Loading Except Taxis	Extent of Restriction
Church Street, Dunoon	On both sides between George Street and Argyll Street.

The Order, which is necessary to facilitate the holding of a Christmas Event and the switching on of the Christmas lights on or near those roads, shall have effect when indicated by signs from 1800 hours on Friday 22nd November to 1900 hours on Saturday the 23rd November Two Thousand and Twenty Four.

Exceptions will apply to vehicles being driven upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform; an emergency services vehicle; or an authorised vehicle associated with the organisation of the event.

The existing one way operation on Church Street between George Street and Argyll Street will be temporarily suspended to permit two-way traffic.

The existing taxi rank on Argyll Street situated between Church Street and John Street will be re-located to Church Street for the duration of the event.

Alternative routes via local diversions will be signed in an appropriate manner.
